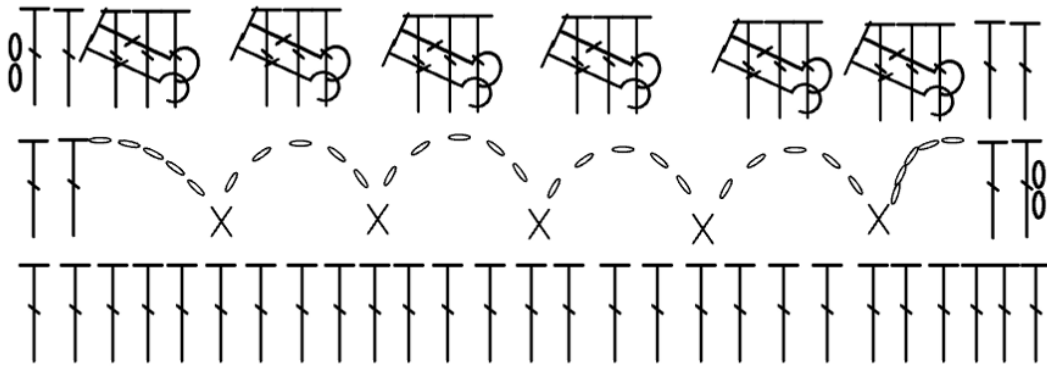


## *Double Wrapped Double Crochet Cluster Stitch*

# Double Wrapped Double Crochet Cluster (2wdc)



**A stitch combination of 11+4 is needed for the Double Wrapped Double Crochet Cluster stitch.**

This is the written definition of this crochet stitch, and the abbreviation I used when writing the crochet pattern.


**2wdc = Double Wrapped Double Crochet Cluster**

3 dc in/under ch5 sp, two dc stitches wrapped around the post of all three dc stitches.

Row 1: ch 37, dc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across. (35 dc)

Row 2: dc in 1st 2 dc st's; ch5, skp 3dc, sc in nxt dc; \*ch5, skp 3dc sc in nxt dc;\* 6x; ch5, skp3 dc; dc in last 2dc; ch2 & turn (8 ch5 sp's)

Row 3:

*2wdc = Double Wrapped Double Crochet Cluster*

*3 dc in/under ch5 sp, two dc stitches wrapped around the post of all three dc stitches.*

dc in 1st 2 st's; \*2wdc in nxt ch5 sp;\* 8x; dc in last 2 st's; ch2 and turn (8 - 2wdc)

Repeat Rows 2 & 3 until you are happy with the length.

I think this stitch would be lovely as a summer tee, or on the bottom of a tunic. I have made a baby blanket, scarf and hat using this stitch. It never disappoints.
